4.1. Course objectives (including form of classes)

C-1 (WW) – introduction to the basic assumptions of pedeutology; issues of pedeutology; language of pedeutology and pedeutological achievements;

C-2-(UW) – introduction to understanding the meaning of the teaching profession and its role and position in society and culture;

C-3-(KW)– development of pedagogical sensitivity, pedagogical tact, ability to cooperate with the student and to recognize and response adequately to his/her needs in order to support his/her progress;

C-1 (WC) – introduction to the basic issues of pedeutology, pedeutological problems, role and tasks of the teachers over the centuries and contemporarily;

C-2-(UC) – introduction to understanding the importance of the professional development of a teacher and pedagogist and to undertake own professional development;

C-3- (KC) - development of pedagogical sensitivity and ability to cooperate with the student in compliance with the rules of professional ethics and professionalism.

4.2. Detailed syllabus (including form of classes)

Lecture topics:

Introduction to the syllabus and requirements related to the completion of the course. Genesis and Polish traditions of pedeutology as a pedagogical sub-discipline, basic terminology, stages of development as a scientific discipline. The role of the teacher, the teaching profession and its contemporary changes. Socio-cultural, humanistic and educational values of the teacher's and pedagogist's personality in the process of teaching, upbringing and in the context of relations with society. Reflective dimensions of teacher's professionalism in a lifelong learning perspective. Ethical basics of the teaching and pedagogical profession. Selected contemporary problems of the teaching and pedagogical profession (e.g. quality of a teacher's and pedagogist's work, learning organisation and role of a teacher, career paths of creative teachers, generational change in the teaching profession, economic aspects of education as well as teaching and pedagogical professions, etc.)

Practical training topics:

Introduction to the syllabus and requirements related to the completion of the course. Basic issues of pedeutology as a science. Overview of the role, tasks and function of a teacher over the centuries. Professional development of a teacher, professional promotion and improving teacher's skills. Living and working conditions of a teacher and pedagogist. Contemporary problems of the teaching and pedagogical profession (e.g. burnout, feminization of the profession, cooperation between teachers and parents)
