4. OBJECTIVES, SYLLABUS CONTENT AND INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES

4.1. Course objectives (including form of classes)

4.1. Objectives of the course (taking into account the form of classes)

Lecture

C1. To acquaint students with the knowledge of the detailed issues of professional ethics, with particular emphasis on the profession of a social worker, with the determinants of value conflicts in social work, presentation of the meaning of values in the work of a social worker, their continuity and dynamics of change.

C2. Preparing students to solve selected problems in the area of social action in relation to the individual and social groups based on professional ethics.

C3. Shaping the attitude of openness and activity in perceiving moral dilemmas of contemporary man.

Exercises

C1. Acquainting students with various determinants of recognized values and value systems in contemporary societies.

C2. Preparing students to generalize the results of observation of the behavior of an individual and social groups in the context of the recognized and realized values of diagnosing the needs of an individual and designing the way of social activity.

C3. Shaping the attitude of readiness to solve social problems using the key values of social work in order to support people in need of help, shaping the attitude of readiness to professional behavior, reflecting on ethical issues and behaving in accordance with the professional ethics of a social worker.

4.2. Detailed syllabus (including form of classes)

Lecture

1. Findings Acquainting with the course sheet and requirements in connection with passing the course - instructions for constructing a project and requirements for passing the course (group discussion). Conceptual arrangements: ethics, profession, professional community, professional ethics, deontology. Code of ethics of a social worker. Continuity and dynamics of changes in the recognition of values by social workers. Value theories. (information lecture, seminar lecture)

2. Problems of modern societies (marginalization, anomie, identity disorder, risk society, disability, etc. as the basis for the activities of a social worker, taking into account the basic values of social work. Value conflicts - ethical dilemmas in social work (problem lecture, seminar lecture)

3. The dispute over professional ethics, its justification and scope. Catalog of values for a specific profession. Ethical norms regulating relations within the community of social workers. The problem of codification of professional ethics standards (seminar and problem lecture)

4. New professional roles of a social worker (local social politician, environmental animator. Deontology of the profession of a social worker in the context of the postulate of a reliable caretaker (informative and problematic lecture)

5. Theoretical and methodological orientations in the field of social work. Paradigms of social work in the European perspective. Selected theoretical orientations in contemporary social work and their relationship with the values of social work. Work ethic (problem lecture, seminar lecture)

Exercises

1. Classifications and characteristics of the value of social work. Basic principles of ethics in social work (group discussion)

2. Axiological education of a social worker, principles of constructing axiological sequences; value conflicts in social work and the possibility of solving them reflectivity and ethical responsibility of a social worker, strategies for dealing with ethical dilemmas (group discussion, simulation method)

3. The use of the axiology of social work to act in the face of poverty, poverty and unemployment, for the benefit of the family and children, and to prevent the behavior of children and adolescents. Work ethics, solidarity and community, problems of exploitation, suffering and illusion (problem lecture (film, group discussion, didactic workshops)

4. Presentation and evaluation of projects / posters prepared by students (project method)
