4.1. Course objectives (including form of classes)

1.1. Objectives of the course (taking into account the form of classes)

Lecture

- C1. (knowledge) familiarizing students with key values in social work, defining values, classification, value system, hierarchy of values, value conflicts, presenting the meaning of values in the work of a social worker, their continuity and dynamics of change

Exercises

- 2. Sources of axionormative changes in the twenty-first century. Problems of contemporary societies (marginalization, anomie, disorder
- 3.identities, risk society, disability and others (problem lecture, seminar lecture)
- 4. Value orientations of contemporary societies. Individual social cultural dimension of value. Various axiology
- 5.social groups Axiological dilemmas of modern man (problem lecture)
- 6. Possibilities and limitations of value research. Noepositivist paradigm (quantitative research), phenomenological-hermeneutic approach (informative lecture)
- 7. Theoretical and methodological orientations in the field of social work. Paradigms of social work in the European perspective.

Selected theoretical orientations in contemporary social work and their relationship with the values of social work (problem lecture, seminar lecture)

Exercises:

- 1. Classifications and characteristics of the value of social work. Basic principles of ethics in social work (group discussion)
- 2. Axiological education of a social worker, principles of constructing axiological sequences (group discussion, simulation method)
- 3. The use of the axiology of social work to act in the face of poverty, poverty and unemployment, for the benefit of the family and children, prevention of behavior of children and adolescents (film, group discussion, didactic workshops)
