4. OBJECTIVES, SYLLABUS CONTENT AND INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES

4.1. Course objectives (including form of classes)

1.1. Objectives of the course (taking into account the form of classes)

Lecture

C1. Familiarizing students with the basic issues related to family issues: the concept, functions of the family, cultural models of the family, showing the direction of changes in the contemporary family and its alternative forms

C2. Preparing students to solve selected problems in the area of the functioning of an individual and a social group - the family

C3. Shaping the attitude of openness and activity in perceiving moral dilemmas of contemporary man

Exercises

C1. Familiarizing students with various conditions of the functioning of the modern family, the continuity and dynamics of changes in this social group

C2. Preparing students to generalize the results of observing the behavior of an individual and social groups in the context of current social and cultural conditions, diagnosing the individual's needs and designing the way of social activity

C3. Shaping the attitude of readiness to solve social problems in order to support people in need of help.

4.2. Detailed syllabus (including form of classes)

4.2. Program content (including the form of classes)

Lecture:

1. Acquainting with the course card and the requirements for completing the course - instructions for constructing a poster and requirements for completing the course (group discussion)

2. The concept of a family, analysis of selected shots. Family and its development, stages of family life and their importance. Family functions and the direction of their changes (informative lecture, seminar lecture)

3. Family against the background of global problems (marginalization, anomy, identity disorder, risk society, disability, etc. (problem lecture, seminar lecture)

4. Methodological models of family research. Phylogenetic and ontogenetic perspective (informative lecture, problem lecture)

5. Axiology of contemporary families, consistency of the parents' value system with their children's value system (problem lecture)

6. Determinants of family changes. Family typologies (informative lecture, seminar lecture)

7. Family in the social environment. The relationship of the family with society (information lecture, seminar lecture)

8. A sociological approach to the family. Family and other social groups. The structure of the modern family i (problem lecture)

9. Threats to the functioning of modern families and their determinants. The dynamics of the phenomenon in the European perspective (problem lecture)

10. Social work in the face of the problems of the contemporary family. The tasks of social work and the scope of social assistance in the light of the current regulations (information and problem lecture) (problem lecture, seminar lecture)

Exercises:

1. Socio-cultural determinants of family transformations (group discussion, case studies)

2. Family in a risk society (group discussion, simulation method)

3. The family as an educational environment. Educational atmosphere in the family, upbringing styles, parental attitudes (group discussion, case studies)

4. Threats to the functioning of the modern family and their determinants. Family dysfunction - causes, symptoms, effects. Diagnosis of the phenomenon (group discussion, simulation method)

5. Social work for dysfunctional people and families. Help for perpetrators and victims of violence, addicts (group discussion, case studies)

6. The use of the axiology of social work to act in the face of poverty, poverty and unemployment, for the benefit of the family and children, prevention of the behavior of children and adolescents, adults (film, group discussion)

7. Institutions supporting the child and family. Models of help and support (group discussion, case studies)

8. Presentation and evaluation of projects / posters prepared by students (project method)
